International Postgraduate Program Application Guidelines Doctoral Program in Medicine, Graduate School of Medicine, Kansai Medical University

1 Purpose and objectives of the International Postgraduate Program

The Doctoral Program in Medicine at the Kansai Medical University (KMU) Graduate School of Medicine started the International Postgraduate Program in Autumn 2022 with the aim of fostering leaders able to contribute to medicine and healthcare in various countries and regions including Asia, the Middle East and Eastern Europe by accepting outstanding international students recommended from partner universities. International graduate students enrolled in this program will not only conduct their own research activities, but will also be able to actively participate in a range of cultural and community activities, to further broaden their knowledge.

After completing the program, the international graduate students are expected to return to their home countries and contribute to their home countries in the field of highly advanced medicine and healthcare as alumni of our graduate school. They are also expected to contribute directly or indirectly to the improvement of relations between Japan and other countries through various activities not limited to the field of medicine and medical care.

2 Educational mission

The Doctoral Program in Medicine at the Kansai Medical University Graduate School of Medicine is designed to provide students with the advanced research skills necessary to become independent medical researchers who can engage in international research activities, and to cultivate students' robust academic knowledge and humanity suitable for leadership positions by studying and researching the basic theories of basic life sciences regarding medicine and their application to advanced medical treatment in a highly specialized research field integrating basic, social, and clinical medicine.

- (1) Promotion of medical research: To create a world-class research center to explore the truth of life phenomena and produce world-class medical research results.
- (2) Nurturing medical researchers: To nurture outstanding medical researchers who can conduct original research activities from an international perspective, have the ability to guide future generations, and possess a rich humanity and broad academic knowledge.
- (3) Cultivation of highly specialized medical professionals: To cultivate medical leaders who have acquired advanced and specialized medical knowledge and skills, and who have the ability to develop clinical research rooted in medical treatment.
- (4) Contribute to society: To apply the results of basic, social, and clinical medical research to healthcare, contribute to the improvement of human health and welfare, and use the results as intellectual property to return to society at large.

3 Admission Policy, Curriculum Policy, and Diploma Policy

Admission Policy

The Graduate School of Medicine admits applicants who;

- 1. are passionate about creating world-class medical research results.
- 2. are motivated to work as excellent medical researchers and aspire to pioneering research activities.
- 3. are motivated to play an active role in the medical field as a leading medical professional.
- 4. are determined to contribute to the improvement of human health and welfare by applying the results of medical research.

Curriculum Policy

- 1. The program consists of research work in which students receive individual research guidance in each research field, as well as coursework in which students acquire the knowledge and skills necessary for medical research in a wide range of fields beyond the boundaries of each research field.
- 2. In the coursework, in addition to learning the essential knowledge for conducting medical research in the common courses, students participate in one of the four required elective courses to broaden their perspectives through regular course meetings and retreats (research camps), and receive guidance for research presentations.
- 3. In the third year, each required elective course holds a graduate student midterm presentation meeting, and students receive checks and guidance from course faculty members toward their degrees.
- 4. Students will attend lectures by prominent researchers from Japan and abroad in special seminars and graduate school lecture series.
- 5. To take full advantage of KMU's well-equipped joint research facilities, students attend workshops on their use and lectures in the Research Techniques Series.

Diploma Policy

The degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Medicine will be conferred to those who successfully complete the Doctoral Program in Medicine at the Kansai Medical University Graduate School of Medicine and are recognized as having met all of the following educational goals.

- 1. Acquire advanced information gathering and analysis skills, and the ability to interpret data based on a scientific attitude.
- 2. Acquire a wide range of academic knowledge in medicine and a high level of ethics.
- 3. Acquire the specialized knowledge and research skills necessary to conduct independent research in one's field of specialty.
- 4. Acquire the capacity to publish research results and disseminate information globally.

The following two types of scholarships will be called for

- MEXT-SCHOLARSHIP (Japanese Government Scholarships - UNIVERSITY RECOMMENDATION);

Japanese Government-sponsored international students, through "a special program that provides priority placement for government-sponsored international students (research students)".

- KMU-SCHOLARSHIP;

Privately funded students who receive a scholarship from the Graduate School of Medicine, Kansai Medical University.

^{*}In years 1 and 2, students are required to take Japanese language courses in the course titled "IPP course." Students may choose to continue their Japanese language studies in their third year if desired.

9 Completion requirements for conferment of the degree.

- (1) In principle, students must be enrolled in the Graduate School of Medicine for four years or more, earn 30 credits in prescribed class subjects, receive necessary research guidance, and pass the dissertation review and final examination.
- (2) The period of enrollment may be changed to three years for those who have achieved outstanding research results and meet the prescribed requirements.

MEXT-SCHOLARSHIP

(Japanese Government Scholarships-UNIVERSITY RECOMMENDATION) Application requirements

1 Entrance examination eligibility

Applicants must meet the following requirements (1) or (2), and (3) through (9). *MEXT may change these requirements.

- (1) Applicants must have completed 18 years of academic education (the last course being medicine) in a foreign country. However, if the last course is a six-year course, less than 18 years is acceptable.
- (2) Academic education in a foreign country as described above, including those who have completed a course of five years or more in the final course of study, awarded by a foreign school that has received an evaluation by a person certified by the government or a related organization of the foreign country, or a course separately designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) as equivalent to this evaluation.
- (3) As a general rule, applicants must have been born on or after April 2, 1990. Exceptions to this age requirement are limited to cases where MEXT determines that the applicant was unable to apply at the time of eligibility due to the system or circumstances of the country of nationality (mandatory military service, loss of educational opportunities due to war, etc.). No personal circumstances will be accepted.
- (4) Applicants must meet one of the following requirements for proficiency in either the Japanese or English languages.

Japanese Language

- i) Applicants who have passed the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) level N2 or higher by the admission.
- ii) Applicants who have completed an educational course that satisfies the qualifications for admission to a master's, doctoral course in Japan using Japanese as the main language.
- iii) Applicants who are regarded by Kansai Medical University (KMU) as having Japanese language ability equivalent to or better than i).

• English Language

- i) By the admission, the applicant must have a score equivalent to or higher than B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) in English.
- ii) Applicants who have completed an educational course that satisfies the qualifications for admission to a master's, or doctoral course using English as the main language.
- iii) Applicants whom KMU judges has English language skills equivalent to or higher than those required.
- (5) Applicants must be nationals of one of the following countries and newly arrive from abroad to study in Japan.

Indonesia, Cambodia, Singapore, Thailand, Philippines, Brunei, Vietnam, Malaysia, Myanmar, Laos

- (6) Applicants whose status of residence is "Student" at the time of admission to KMU. According to MEXT visa requirement, applicants shall, in principle, newly obtain a "Student" visa at the Japanese diplomatic mission located in the applicant's country of nationality, and enter Japan with the residence status of "Student."
- (7) Applicants must be able to guarantee that they will be admitted to KMU if they pass the screening exam.
- (8) As a general rule, applicants must be able to travel to Japan during the two-week period specified by KMU, counting from/to the date of admission (September 1, 2025).
- (9) Applicants must meet the conditions specified in the "Application Guidelines: Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarships."

KMU will recommend the successful applicants to MEXT with the necessary documents. MEXT will review the documents, and determine the recipients of the scholarship.

4 Selection

Documents screening and online interview

(30 minutes per person for the online interview: interview should be based on statement of purposes for application and other topics related to application documents)

5 Research field

To be selected from among the Research Fields offered in the Doctoral Program, and to be determined after interviewing with the supervising professor in advance. (For details, please refer to the research fields.)

6 Financial support (maximum, 4 years of the standard study period (September 2025-August 2029))

- (1)Transportation to Japan: MEXT will stipulate the travel schedule and route, and provide an economy class airline ticket from the international airport nearest to the international student's residence to the international airport used by the university as the normal route in Japan.
- (2)Transportation from Japan: Based on the application by the grantee, MEXT will provide an airline ticket by the end of the final month of the period of scholarship designated by MEXT. MEXT shall provide an economy class airline ticket from the international airport in Japan used for the normal route to and from the university to the international airport (in principle, in the country of nationality) nearest to the grantee's residence.
 - If the student returns home country before the end of the scholarship period due to personal circumstances, MEXT will not pay for the returning travel expenses. If the student continues to stay in Japan after the scholarship period, travel expenses for a temporary return will also not be paid.
- (3)Domestic transportation from the airport in Japan to KMU (train, limousine bus from the airport, etc.)
- (4)Application fee, admission fee, and tuition fee
- (5) Dormitory fees (Kansai Medical University International Student Dormitory)
- (6)Scholarship (148,000 yen/month). (However, the amount is subject to change.)
- (7)Other expenses as deemed necessary by Kansai Medical University (TBD)
 - * In the event that a student is unable to complete the course of study within the standard period of four years, the student will be required to pay the tuition for the fifth and subsequent years.

7 Other conditions

- (1) If the GPA at any point in the year falls below 2.30 at KMU, the student will lose eligibility for the MEXT-SCHOLARSHIP (UNIVERSITY RECOMMENDATION).
- (2)The "Application Guidelines: Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarships" set forth by the MEXT, the granting agency of the MEXT-SCHOLARSHIP (UNIVERSITY RECOMMENDATION), has established provisions regarding personal information. This program is envisioned to be used for international student projects implemented by the Japanese government (employment support, support during study abroad, follow-up, and improvement of the international student system) and for public relations to promote the acceptance of international students. These matters are included in the Pledge stipulating rules and regulations which MEXT Scholarship students must comply with and submit when they have been granted the scholarship
- (3) While studying in Japan, as human resources who will contribute to the internationalization of Japan, applicants will contribute to mutual understanding between your home country and Japan by participating in a wide range of local school and community activities, and after graduation, applicants will maintain close ties with the university where they studied, cooperate in surveys and other activities after graduation, and after returning to your home country, cooperate in various projects conducted by diplomatic missions abroad, etc. to promote ties between their country and Japan.

KMU-SCHOLARSHIP Application Requirements

1 Entrance examination eligibility

Applicants must meet the following requirements (1) or (2), and (3) through (5).

- (1) Applicants must have completed 18 years of academic education (the last course being medicine) in a foreign country. However, if the last course is a six-year course, less than 18 years is acceptable.
- (2) Academic education in a foreign country as described above, including those who have completed a course of five years or more in the final course of study, awarded by a foreign school that has received an evaluation by a person certified by the government or a related organization of the foreign country, or a course separately designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) as equivalent to this evaluation.
- (3) Applicants must have been recommended by the president or dean of the partner university or embassy of the applicant's country, and have graduated from a medical school (Bachelor of Medicine). Those with a medical license are preferred.
- (4) Applicants whose status of residence is "Student" at the time of admission to KMU.
- (5) Applicants must be able to guarantee that they will matriculate to the Doctoral Program of the Graduate School of Medicine, Kansai Medical University if they pass the screening exam.

4 Selection

Documents screening and online interview

(30 minutes per person for the online interview: interview should be based on the statement of purposes for application and other topics related to application documents)

5 Research field

To be selected from among the Research Fields offered in the Doctoral Program, and to be determined after interviewing with the supervising professor in advance. (Please see the details of the research fields)

6 Financial support, etc. (maximum, 4 years of the standard study period (September 2025 - August 2029))

- (1) Round trip airfare from the country of origin to Japan (economy class)
 - *Airfare at the time of enrollment and at the time of returning from Japan upon completion of the program
- (2) Domestic transportation from the airport in Japan to KMU (train, limousine bus from the airport, etc.)
- (3) Application fee, admission fee, and tuition fee
- (4) Dormitory fees (Kansai Medical University International Student Dormitory)
- (5) Scholarship (150,000 yen/month)
- (6) Other expenses as deemed necessary by KMU.

*In the event that a student is unable to complete the course of study within the standard period of four years, the student will be required to pay the tuition for the fifth and subsequent years, and airfare at the time of returning from Japan upon completion of / withdrawal from the program.

7 Other conditions

- (1) Graduates must promptly return to their home country as soon as possible after completing the International Postgraduate Program, and contribute to their home country in the field of highly specialized medicine and medical care as an alumnus of the graduate school of Kansai Medical University.
- (2) Graduates must cooperate with activities required by Kansai Medical University, such as post-graduation surveys, as necessary.



Kansai Medical University is selected by the Immigration Services Agency of Japan, as a "zaisekikanriyuryoukou(在籍管理優良校)", which is a recognition for managing the enrollment of international students appropriately.
